The Officers for the Commonwealth of Virginia for the County of Loudoun upon their oath present that Richard Minter of the Parish of Shelburn - and County of Loudoun aforesaid on the <sup>1810<sup>o</sup></sup> day of 1811 - in the 33<sup>th</sup> - year of the Commonwealth with force and arms at the Parish aforesaid, and County aforesaid, feloniously did enter the shop of Daniel McCallister in the said Parish of Shelburn <sup>Seabury</sup> Town of and County of Loudoun, and did then and there feloniously, steal take, and carry away twelve or sixteen Musk Ral skins, <sup>of the value of one dollar & seventy five cents</sup> the property of the said Daniel McCallister - against the form of the Statute in such case made and provided and against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth.
