Virginia Loudoun County, to wit:

The Jurors of the Commonwealth for the County of Loudoun upon their oath present ^{that} Eliza, a free Man of colour, late of the Parish of Shelburne - and County aforesaid, of Loudoun aforesaid, - on the first day of August - in the year ⁽¹⁸¹²⁾ and in the ~~37th~~ year of the Commonwealth with force and arms, at the Parish aforesaid in the County aforesaid, One pair of pantaloons, and one pair of Shoes of the value of One dollar & Twenty five Cents the property of John Cole then and there found and being did feloniously steal take and carry away against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth.
