# STATE OF VIRGINIA--

## LOUDOUN COUNTY TO WIT:

RICHARD H. HENDERSON, Attorney for the Commonwealth for the County court of Loudoun, being present here in Court this *eleventh* day of *August* in the year eighteen hundred and thirty *six* gives the court to understand and be informed that *Nammy Stoner* a free negro emancipated in the State of Virginia since the first day of May in the year eighteen hundred and six, did, without having permission so to do according to law, at the County aforesaid, and within the jurisdiction of this Court, remain in said County more than twelve months after he was emancipated, to wit from the *first* day of *X* *June* in the year eighteen hundred and thirty *five* to the *first* day of *June* in the year eighteen hundred and thirty *six*; contrary to the form of the Acts of the General Assembly in such cases provided, and against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth.

And so the said attorney prays the advice of the court in the premises, and that due process of law be awarded against the said
