more than twelve months after she was emancipated, to wit from the *first* day of *June*

X X day of *June* in the year eighteen hundred and thirty *six* ;

contrary to the form of the Acts of the General Assembly in such cases provided, and against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth.

And so the said attorney prays the advice of the court in the premises, and that due process of
