Loudoun County to wit

Be it remembered that on the 22^d day of October 1835 Anthony Lucas and Henry Lucas both of New Guinea in the said County free Mullatoes and Thomas White gentleman of said county came before me ^{themselves} Justice of the peace for the county aforesaid and acknowledged to owe to L. W. Tazewell esquire governor or chief magistrate of the commonwealth of Virginia and his successors to wit the said Anthony Lucas the sum of fifty dollars the said Henry Lucas the sum of fifty dollars and the said Thomas White the sum of one hundred dollars, current money of Virginia to be levied respectively levied and made of their several goods and chattles lands and tenements, to the use of the commonwealth aforesaid if they ^{they} said Anthony Lucas and Henry Lucas shall fail in performing the condition under written.

The condition of this recognizance is such that if the above bound Anthony Lucas and Henry Lucas shall personally appear at the next court to be holden in and for the county of Loudoun aforesaid to do and receive what shall ^{them} and there be enjoined them by the said court and in the mean time shall ^{the} peace towards the commonwealth and all its citizens and especially towards James West and George Thompson free Mullatoes of New Guinea in the said county: Then this recognizance ~~to~~ shall be void or else remain in full force. Given under my this 22^d day of October 1835
