into the *County*

for the county of Loudoun aforesaid.

And gives the said court to understand and be informed that *Winney Ramsey* ^{*she was called Winney Ramsey*} now a free negro ^{*late a slave emancipated since the first day of May in the year 1806 viz: on the 31 day of May in the year 1847 and having attained the age of twenty one years before the first day of May in the year 1847*}

late of the Parish of *Shelburne*

in the county of Loudoun aforesaid

did on the *first* day of

June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and *forty eight*

in the county aforesaid and within the jurisdiction of the said court remain *contrary to law within the Commonwealth aforesaid more than twelve months after her right to freedom accrued viz: from the thirty first day of May in the year 1847 to the first day of June in the year 1848 and thence up to the commencement of this prosecution and is now remaining contrary to law in the said Commonwealth*

Contrary to the form of the statute in such case made provided and

against the peace and dignity of the commonwealth aforesaid; whereupon the said Attorney for the common-

wealth, in the court aforesaid, prays the consideration of the court here in the premises and that due process

of law may be awarded against the said *Winney Ramsey*

to make ^{*her*} answer the commonwealth touching and concerning the premises aforesaid, &c.
