The Commonwealth of Virginia,

To the Sheriff of Loudoun County--Greeting:

YOU are hereby commanded to summon *Lewis Jackson* a free man of
Colour formerly the property of *John Nixon dec^d*.

to appear before the Judge of our Circuit Superior Court of Law and Chancery of the county
of Loudoun, at the Court-house of the said county, on the *1st* day of *April*
Court, 1849, to testify and the truth to speak on behalf of the ~~in a~~
~~certain matter of controversy depending and undetermined in the said Court, between~~
shew cause why an information should not be filed against him
upon a presentment of the Grand Jury made against him in
the said Court, on the 23^d day of October 1848, for remaining
in this Commonwealth, viz; in this County more than twelve
months after his right to freedom accrued.

And this *he* — shall in no wise omit under the penalty of 100^l. And have
then there this writ. Witness THOMAS P. KNOX, Clerk of our said Circuit Superior
Court, at the Court-house aforesaid, the *16th* day of *February* — 1849,
and in the *7th* year of the Commonwealth.
