This day personally appears before me, a Justice of the peace for the County aforesaid, William Nolan, and made oath, that Alexander, commonly called Sandy, who served ~~the~~ Thomas R. Mott of Loudoun County and his executor, until he arrived at the age of twenty seven, is the son of a coloured free woman by the name of Bet that the said Bet was sold for a term of years by William Dulin under the Will of his mother Sarah Dulin, dated the 4th of June 1800; and that the time of service of Bet and her son Sandy has expired.

Given under my hand this 25th May 1835

Loudoun County to wit:

This day Rich^d Henderson made oath before me that he is the executor of Thos R. Mott, that he has surrendered the above named Sandy, or given up all claim to him he being now entitled to his freedom; said Sandy now in the Clerk's office of the County Court of Loudoun is black, has a mark on the fore finger of the left hand not very deep and another at the end of the fore finger of the right hand, and is about five feet seven inches in height and half high.
