In pursuance of an act of the General Assembly of Virginia, passed on the 2nd day of March, 1819, entitled "An act reducing into one the several acts concerning Slaves, Free Negroes and Mulattoes," I, ALEXANDER J. MARSHALL, Clerk of the County Court of Fauquier, do hereby certify, that Benjamin Coram, a dark mulatto man, with a small scar on the inside of the right little finger near the nail, occasioned by a smash, another scar on the inside of the left thumb extending upwards occasioned by a cut with a knife

aged about twenty four years, five feet nine and a half inches high, who was born free,

is registered in my office agreeably

to the directions of the above mentioned Act.
