cause to be made the sum of *Ten* dollars and *25⁻* cents, with interest
thereon from the *2nd* day of *January*, 1849, till paid, which

Silas Marmaduke lately before *John H. White* one of the Commonwealth's Justices
of the Peace for said county, hath recovered against him for debt, also *thirty* cents for
costs in that suit expended, and that you have the said debt and costs before the said Justice within sixty days, to
render unto the said *Silas Marmaduke* his debt and costs aforesaid; and have
